1. THE POST

1.1 Title:

Foundation Year 2, Obstetrics & Gynaecology Department

1.2 Employing Organisation:

Milton Keynes Hospital NHS Foundation Trust

1.3 Accountable to:

The appointee will be accountable to the Consultants and Clinical Director for the Obstetrics & Gynaecology Department.

2. THE DEPARTMENT

The gynaecology outpatients department in the Main Outpatients Department is provided with 3 fully equipped consulting rooms. The clinic is pleasantly designed and in close proximity to the general clinics. Obstetric outpatient clinics are also held in this building.

The Obstetrics Department comprises a labour suite with 11 delivery rooms. Each clinical area is lead by a Senior Midwife. Currently there is 1 x 26 bedded mixed antenatal and postnatal ward. There is an epidural service for pain relief in labour. An established Pre-Natal Screening Service is in place. There is also a Day Assessment Unit which is led by a midwife.

The labour ward is supported by a Neonatal Unit which has 18 cots.

GYNAECOLOGY PROVISION

Gynaecology in-patients are situated in the Treatment Centre, a bright and modern building which was opened in 2005. There is a combined Surgical Assessment Unit (SAU) for surgical and gynaecological emergency admissions referred in by their general practitioners. Facilities for diagnostic and therapeutic hysteroscopy, endometrial ablation and colposcopy are available. Minimal access surgery is well established at this hospital.

Each Consultant has one general Gynaecology clinic and one special interest clinic covering areas such as colposcopy, infertility, gynaecological urology and more complex gynaecological problems.

The Early Assessment Pregnancy Unit is based in the out-patient department in the Main Outpatient Department. It is a nurse-led Monday to Friday service. This service has the support of an ultrasonographer and therefore assists with the early assessment and management of pregnancy complications.

3. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

You will be directly responsible to the Consultants for whom they work.

You will be expected to provide support in all aspects of the Obstetrics and Gynaecology service by maintaining continuity of patient care, assisting at operations, Out-Patient Clinics and in Labour Ward.

You will be the first on call for acute admission.

The rota will be a shift comprising three/four nights in a row from 21.00 – 09.00, and an evening shift from 17.00 – 21.00.

Prospective cover for annual leave, study leave and days in lieu is included.

You will not be able to take annual/study leave at the same time as another colleague on the rota and there should be at least six weeks notice given before commencement of leave. All leave has to be approved by your supervising Consultant and administrative Consultant/rota person.

4. TEACHING AND AUDIT

The department has a regular clinical meeting every week and a half day session per month for Medical Audit. Teaching goes on at all times in the form of ward rounds, in clinic and in theatre. In addition, there are more formal sessions one weekday afternoon every week including obstetric drills and topics aimed at DRCOG and MRCOG.
